The Wednesday Word, August 4, 2021: Sin 'In' or 'On' the Believer

"Did both thieves die in the same way?"

"What or who made the difference?"

"Jesus"

"Yes indeed! One thief trusted on Christ and the other didn't. But let's look at this, the one thief who didn't trust Christ, had he sin on him?"

"Yes, he was a thief and maybe even a murderer and was responsible for his sins. His sins were on him."

"That's a fact. And Christ, had He sin in Him?"
